Cataloguing, digitalization, document analysis, academic use.

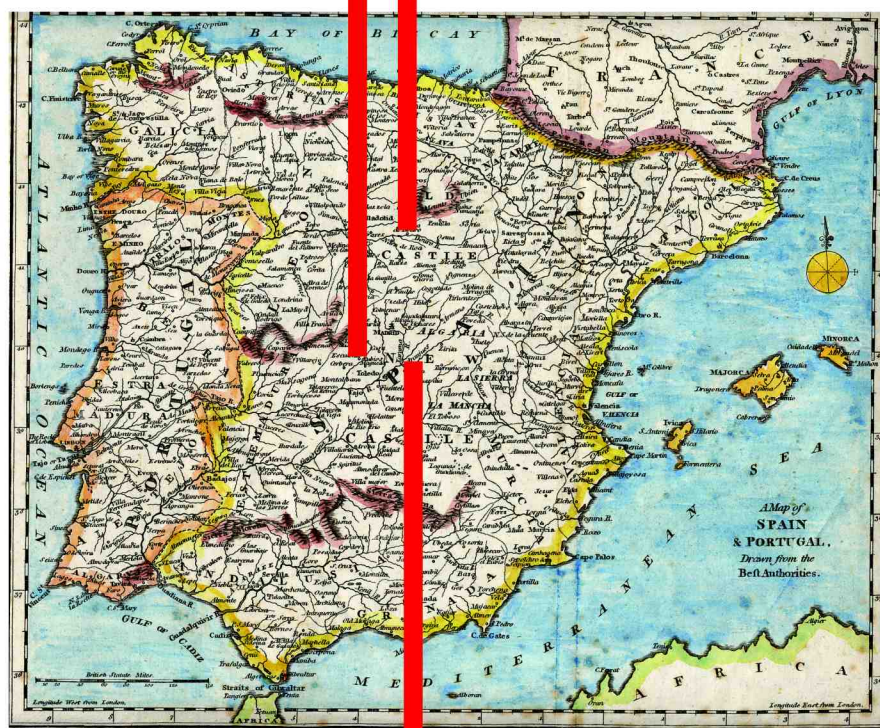
