- Deployable


From simple lists of documents to full descriptions.


Non auctor sed compilator ... over 800 years of cataloguing so far

- XML – open data
 - XSLT – turn XML into something else
 - METS – record relationships between parts of “document”
 - RDF – record links between digital objects

- XTF – search and display XML simply
 - Fedora-Commons – digital repository framework
